CANSKATE Events

- Must have passed the STAR 1 Skills assessment
- One program to music a maximum of 45 seconds
- Three Program Components will be assessed to standard: Skating Skills, Performance, and Interpretation

CANSKATE Challenge Event Stage 1-6

CANSKATE Improv Event

Creative Improv performances are designed only by the skater with minimal preparation. Creative Improv assesses the skater's ability to quickly interpret a given piece of music

- 30 second piece of music
- Full Ice solo event
- Skaters may not have passed any STARSkate assessment
- All the skaters in each flight for an event are presented with a pre-selected piece of music by the Chief Referee/Tech Rep prior to the warm-up.
- All skaters in the flight for that event will perform to the same musical selection.
- Skaters will listen to the music twice in a designated area (i.e., dressing room or players box) and once on-ice during the warm-up period.
- Skaters are then kept in a sound-proof dressing room until it is their turn to perform.
- Coaches will be allowed to assist skaters minimally during warm up



ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Coaches

Skate Canada Coaches who wish to receive accreditation from Skate Canada at the Skate Winnipeg Super Skate Competition must meet the following conditions:

- Regional Coach In Training (STAR 1 and higher events)
- CanSKATE Coach In Training (CANSKATE events)
- Be a current Professional Coaching Member of Skate Canada and in Good Standing
- Coaches must register in person at the registration desk.
- Coaches will have Good Standing Status confirmed prior to receiving accrediation for the event.

Judging System

Cumulative Points Calculation System

All STAR 1-3 events will be assessed to standard. STAR 4 level events will be assessed to standard and ranked. Adult Elements STAR 2&3 are assessed to standard, STAR 4&5 are ranked. STAR 5 and higher events are supported by the Skate Canada CSS software and will be run using the CPC judging system.

Music

All skaters must upload their music in mp3 format upon registration through the registration website. Music must be uploaded to the site in the following format:

FirstNameLastName_Category_Program_XmXs.mp3

For example: JaneDoe_STAR 5 Free_2min 2s.mp3

Skaters are expected to have back up music USB format board side when they compete in case there is an issue with their music. Music will not be accepted on site.

Awards

Skaters in STAR 1, 2 and 3 events will be assessed to a standard (Bronze, Silver or Gold) and will receive a ribbon and feedback form. Skaters in STAR 4 and up will receive a feedback form and medals will be presented to the top three finalists.

We request skating attire is to be worn for pictures during award presentations.

Costuming/Clothing

Clothing of competitors in all disciplines must adhere to the requirements set forth by Skate Canada: Costume/Clothing

Event Registration

Online registrations for Super Skate 2025 are due no later than October 30th, 2025 at 11:59pm CDT. The acceptance of late entries will be allowed until November 1st, at 11:59 pm CDT but a \$75 late fee will be charged. A tentative competition schedule will be posted to Skate Winnipeg's website no later than November 15th. The tenative schedule is subject to change.

Planned Program Sheets

Any entry in STAR 5 or Adult Artistic must upload a Planned Program Content Sheet upon registration. Planned Program Sheets will NOT be accepted on site.

Skate Manitoba Additional Fees:

- A Officials Development \$3.00 fee per participant/ per event must be collected and is remitted to Skate Manitoba
- A Technology \$5.00 per participant fee must be collected (with the exception of CanSKATE Events) and remitted to Skate Canada Manitoba
- Additional fees will be applied upon checkout and are not included in the entry fees above

Refund Policy

No refunds will be given after the closing date of entries for the competition. An Administration fee of \$30 will be applied to all refunds processed. No medical refunds at any time after the registration deadline.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION CONT.

On Site Registration

Skaters must register no later than one hour prior to their first event of the day.

Dressing Rooms

Dressing rooms will be gender neutral and assigned by event. Only registered skaters and coaches will be allowed access to dressing rooms.

Accidents/Liability

Skate Canada, SCMB and Skate Winnipeg and its volunteers undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in this competition, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by or connected with, the conduct and managements of the competitions and to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the association, the Section, Skate Canada, the Local Organizing Committee and against the officers and their entries shall only be accepted on these conditions.

Medical Services

Medical Services available to skaters will be located at ice level.

Skate Manitoba Camera Policy

Flash photography is not permitted. Skate Canada Manitoba restricts the use of cameras and video equipment during Skate Canada sanctioned events out of respect for the safety and to protect the privacy of competing athletes. Spectators are permitted to use cameras at the event for personal use only and are subject to the following conditions:

- Coaches are only permitted to video tape their own skater from the boards during that skater's practice or performance.
- Coaches cannot video tape from the spectator area.
- No flash photography is allowed
- Camera lens must not be larger than 200mm in order to avoid obstructing the view of other spectators
- Any resale of photography or posting photos on websites is strictly prohibited
- Video cameras can only be used by the parent(s) of their own skater during their performance

Anyone who does not abide by these rules risks having their camera confiscated by authorized personell.

Accessibility and Accommodation
